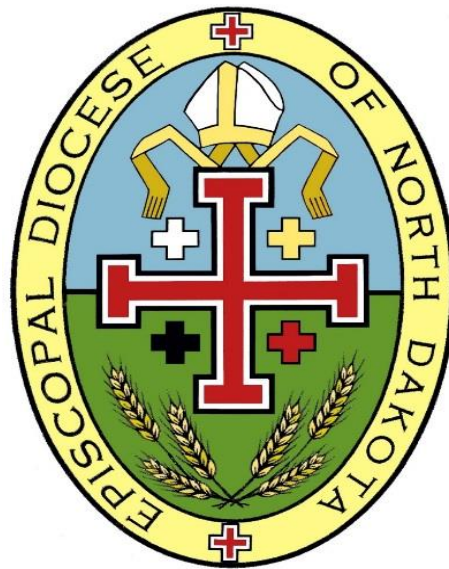

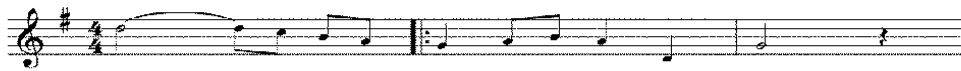

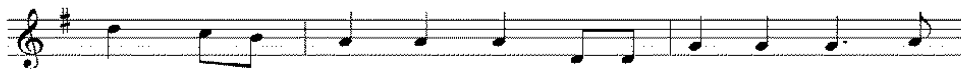

## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Lesson: A reading from the book of Zechariah [8.3-12, 16-17]

Thus says the LORD: I will return to Zion and will dwell in the midst of Jerusalem; Jerusalem shall be called the faithful city, and the mountain of the LORD of hosts shall be called the holy mountain. Thus says the LORD of hosts: Old men and old women shall again sit in the streets of Jerusalem, each with staff in hand because of their great age. And the streets of the city shall be full of boys and girls playing in its streets. Thus says the LORD of hosts: Even though it seems impossible to the remnant of this people in these days, should it also seem impossible to me, says the LORD of hosts? Thus says the LORD of hosts: I will save my people from the east country and from the west country; and I will bring them to live in Jerusalem. They shall be my people and I will be their God, in faithfulness and in righteousness. Thus says the LORD of hosts: Let your hands be strong—you that have recently been hearing these words from the mouths of the prophets who were present when the foundation was laid for the rebuilding of the temple, the house of the LORD of hosts. For before those days there were no wages for people or for animals, nor was there any safety from the foe for those who went out or came in, and I set them all against one another. But now I will not deal with the remnant of this people as in the former days, says the LORD of hosts. For there shall be a sowing of peace; the vine shall yield its fruit, the ground shall give its produce, and the skies shall give their dew; and I will cause the remnant of this people to possess all these things. These are the things that you shall do: Speak the truth to one another, render in your gates judgments that are true and make for peace, do not devise evil in your hearts against one another, and love no false oath; for all these are things that I hate, says the LORD.

And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

The Holy Gospel: Luke 4:14-21

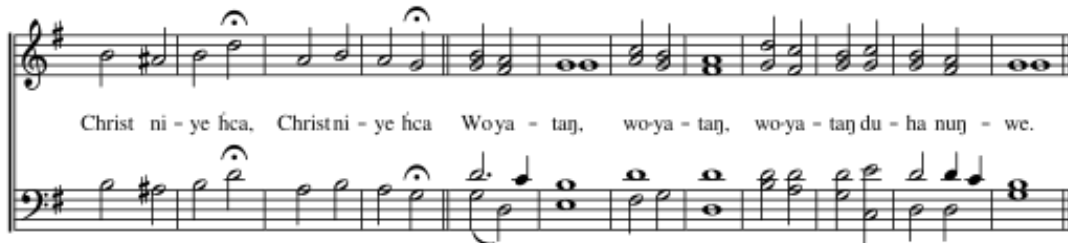
*Deacon*, the Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke,

## RENEWAL OF COVENANTS

*Presider*

Dear friends, the ministry we share is none other than the sacrificial ministry of Christ, who gave himself up to death on the cross for the salvation of the world. By his glorious resurrection he has opened for us the way of everlasting life. By the gift of the Holy Spirit he shares with us the riches of his grace.

The duty of all Christians is to follow Christ; to come together week by week for corporate worship; and to work, pray, and give for the spread of the kingdom of God. Affirming that duty, I invite you to reaffirm your own Baptismal Covenant.

Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

*People*     **I do.**

*Presider*    Do you believe in God the Father?

*People*     **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

*Presider*    Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

*People*

**I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.**

**He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.**

**He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.**

**He descended to the dead.**

**On the third day he rose again.**

**He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.**

**He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

*Presider*    Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

*People*

**I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church,**

**the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,**

**the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

*Presider*

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

*People*

**Help me to use the authority and grace of my baptism to assume responsibility for my part in the life and health of the Church. Help me remain open to receiving wisdom, solace, and strength from Word and sacrament. Help me to be faithful in prayer so that I may listen for your will and be emboldened for service.**

*Presider,*

Will you persevere in resisting evil, and whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

*People,*

**God, help me to seek your ways, not my way. Give me humility to acknowledge my part when I have been complicit with or benefitted from oppression in any form. Grant me courage to confront my failings and to rely on you for guidance in dismantling the sin of racism.**

*Presider,*

Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

*People,*

**Give me grace and strength to model my words and actions on your love, so that I may experience congruence between my life and my faith at all times and in all places.**

*Presider,*

Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

*People,*

**God, help me to live the way Jesus calls us to live. May I embody love and acceptance for all. Work through me so I can best serve you by loving my neighbor, including those who differ from me, as myself.**

*Presider,*

Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

*People,*

**Help me to be like Jesus in seeing and serving all people as beloved. Help me extend welcome to everyone, regardless of color, wealth, status, gender or sexual orientation, even when to do so challenges me to confront my own discomfort or examine prejudices I may have internalized without question.**

**Grant me courage and the gift of discernment to know when to speak, when to wait for your guidance, when to act to glorify your name. Amen.**

*Addressing all lay persons, the Bishop says,*

Your ministry as lay persons is to represent Christ and his Church; to bear witness to him wherever you may be; and, according to the gifts given you, to carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world; and to take your place in the life, worship, and governance of the Church.

Will you continue in this ministry?

*People*

**I will, with God's help.**

*Addressing all deacons, the Bishop says,*

Your ministry as deacons is to represent Christ and his Church, particularly as a servant of those in need; and to assist bishops and priests in the proclamation of the Gospel and the administration of the sacraments.

Will you continue in this ministry?

*Deacons*

I will, with God's help.

*Addressing all priests, the Bishop says,*

Your ministry as priests is to represent Christ and his Church, particularly as pastor to the people; to share with bishops in the overseeing of the Church; to proclaim the Gospel; to administer the sacraments; and to bless and declare pardon in the name of God.

Will you continue in this ministry?

*Priests*

I will, with God's help.

*Bishop*

Brothers and sisters, as clergy in the Episcopal Church, we are called to proclaim Christ's death and resurrection, to administer the Sacraments of the New Covenant which he sealed with his blood on the cross, and to care for his people in the power of the Spirit.

renew your commitment to your ministry,  
under the pastoral direction of your bishop?

Your ministry, as bishop, is to represent Christ and his Church, particularly as apostle, chief priest, and pastor of this diocese; to guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the whole Church; to proclaim the Word of God; to act in Christ's name for the reconciliation of the world and the building up of the Church; and to ordain others to continue Christ's ministry.

Will you continue in this ministry?

*Bishop*

I will with God's help. And as your bishop, I, too, before God and you, re-dedicate myself and reaffirm the promises that I made when I was ordained.

*Leader* In your compassion, heal the wounds our people have suffered due to racism, sexism, homophobia and any sort of discrimination; Creator,  
*People*, **Hear our prayer.**

*Leader* Let the fire of your goodness and justice burn into us and through us, that we may seek to transform the unjust structures of society; Creator,  
*People, Hear our prayer.*

*Leader* As you come into our lives to redeem all that is good, guide us in our turn to renew and sustain the life of your creation; Creator,  
*People, Hear our prayer.*

*Leader* Be with us as we remember our own intentions, which we repeat either silently or aloud. I invite you now to share your prayer petitions [*sustained silence to share our petitions*]; Creator,  
*People, Hear our prayer.*

*Leader* Give rest to all who have died and comfort to those who mourn, let us especially remember those among us who have died since our Diocesan Convention in 2020. Let us take a moment to quietly remember them, and all our departed loved ones; [*sustained silence to remember our departed loved ones*] Creator,  
*People, Hear our prayer.*

*Leader* We commit ourselves individually and as a community to the way of Christ; to take up the Cross; to seek abundant life for all humanity; to struggle for peace with justice and freedom; to risk ourselves in faith, hope, and love, praying that your creation may be made new; Creator,  
*People, Hear our prayer.*

*The Presider says the concluding Collect.*

Change the easy peace we make with ourselves into discontent because of the oppression of others. ## THE HOLY COMMUNION

We praise you and we bless you, holy and gracious God, source of life abundant. From before time you made ready the creation. Your Spirit moved over the deep and brought all things into being: sun, moon, and stars; earth, winds, and waters; and every living thing. You made us in your image, and taught us to walk in your ways. But we rebelled against you, and wandered far away; and yet, as a mother cares for her children, you would not forget us. Time and again you called us to live in the fullness of your love.
