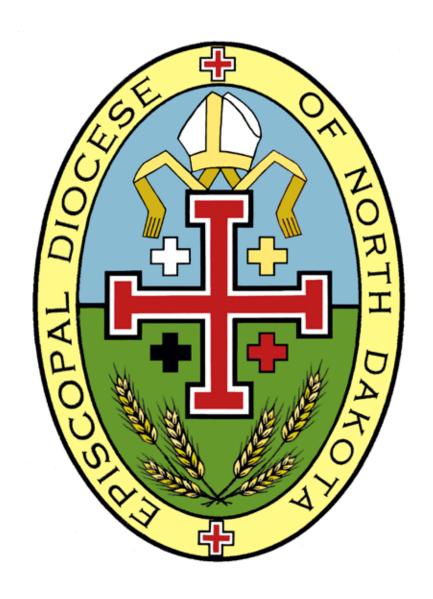

# The Forty-Fifth Annual Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota October 17, 2015 Bismarck, North Dakota

The Forty-Fifth Annual Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota was called to order with opening prayers led by the Rt. Rev. Michael Smith, Bishop of North Dakota, at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, October 17, 2015, at the Radisson Hotel in Bismarck.

The Bishop announced the following appointments for convention:

The Bishop called on Deacon Beth Lipp (St. George's, Bismarck), chair of credentials committee, for a report. Lipp announced that 30 of 37 clergy and 68 of lay delegates have registered making a quorum. Eight guests were also in attendance.

The Bishop announced the nominations of:

Duane Fox (St. Paul's, White Shield) Standing Committee – Clergy (three year term)

Leah Henderson (St. Paul's, Grand Forks) and Elsie Magnus (St. Peter's, Walhalla) – Episcopal Foundation for Higher Education

A motion was made to close the nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for the slate. Motion seconded and approved.

Bishop called on the Rev. James Shannon (St. Paul's, Grand Forks), Dispatch of Business.

The Bishop welcomed the Bishop of South Dakota.

The Bishop introduced the guests from the United Thank Offering (UTO) Rev. Heather Melton and Kayla Massey. To date, UTO has granted \$977,020.83 to North Dakota in the last 125 years.

Pat Fearing and Odella Henley (All Saints', Valley City), co-chairs for UTO, and were called on to give their annual report. \$1,895.53 was given in support of UTO in 2014 and 1,330.08 at the spring ingathering in 2015.

Charlotte Robbins and Ericka Morlan (Gethsemane, Fargo) for Episcopal Relief & Development (ERD) were called to give their annual report. The 75th Campaign will focus on Sustainable Goals specifically three areas: 1. Nets for Life; 2. Cooperative Saving; 3. Alleviating gender-based violence.

The Bishop called on Peterson, treasurer for the diocese, to present the 2016 budget.

The proposed budget is very similar to this year's budget. The draw remains at 6.75%. We would have liked to have decreased it, but were unable to do so and keep funding for programs at current levels. The highlighted lines show grants and spending for Native congregations. The total for NDCIM on the last page of the budget does need to be equal to or greater than the total of the General convention Grant and the Tribal Campus Ministry Grant. Income "From Designated Funds" is coming from the Bakken Ministry Fund and the Sudanese Ministry Fund and being expended on the lines for the Williston Rectory and Sudanese Ministry. Royalty income is down this year. It is unlikely that we will reach the \$22,000 which was budgeted for the current year. On the advice of the Rev. Bart Davis (Grace, Jamestown), we adjusted the Royalty Income to \$15,000, which to him is a more reasonable expectation. Our sup-

port of the National Church is shown on line 20. For the first time we are fulfilling the total amount asked, which is 18%. Although this is up from the 17% of the current year, the actual dollar amount is lower as there has been a change in the calculation. The General Convention Grant is exempt, as is the first \$150,000 (up from \$120,000 in years past). The percentage asked will decrease each of the next two years. The rest of the budget is very similar to last year's. Programs have been funded at the level as last year. The Bishop called for a motion to accept the budget as proposed. It was moved, seconded, and approved.

Leo Wilking (St. Stephen's, Fargo) reported that the North Dakota Episcopal Foundation is prepared to disburse approximately \$10,000 to \$11,000 in grant money in 2016. Grant guidelines, and a grant application, are on the NDEF home page which is under the "Ministries" tab on the web site of the Diocese. The deadline for grant applications is January 15, 2016. Grant monies will be disbursed in March 2016.

Joseph Warren (St. Peter's, Williston) and Tom Tudor (St. George's, Bismarck) were nominated as Trustee's for the North Dakota Episcopal Foundation (4 year-term). Motion made to accept, seconded and passed.

The Bishop referred to the sheet in packets appointing various committees of the diocese and asked for ratification of the disciplinary board which has been approved by the Standing Committee. By voice vote delegates ratified the appointments to the disciplinary board.

John Floberg (Standing Rock) and Terry Overbo (Gethsemane, Fargo) reported on the Acolyte Festival to be held at Gethsemane Cathedral, Fargo the weekend on November 20, 21, 22.

Shannon announced rooms for the regional meetings to be held at 1 o'clock, following lunch. Iverson chairs the West meeting and the Rev. Barb Olson (St. John's, Moorhead) the East meeting.

Convention business adjourned temporarily in order to travel to St. George's for the convention Eucharist.

Following the convention Eucharist, lunch, and the regional meetings, the convention reconvened for the afternoon's business.

It was announced that the elections for Diocesan Council from the western regional meeting were the Rev. Paul Zaharia (All Saints', Minot), Elaine McLaughlin (St. James', Cannon Ball), and the Rev. Mary Johnson (All Saints', Minot) and from the eastern region Helgaas and the Rev. Duffy Williams (Gethsemane, Fargo) were elected.

Floberg reported on the Diocesan Pooled Endowment Fund which is open to all parishes in the Diocese.

The Bishop asked Johnson to present the courtesy resolutions – they are as follows:

1. **Whereas,** our Diocesan Council has brought members, friends, and guests of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota together for our annual Convention in the centrally-located city of Bismarck; and **Whereas,** the people, staff, and clergy of St. George's Church, Bismarck have worked hard to make this 45th Convention a success;

**Therefore, Be it Resolved** by this 45th Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota, that we express our gratitude to the members of the Diocesan Council, Canons Zanne Ness and John Floberg, The Rev. James Zotalis, Terry Ness, and the people of St. George's Church for their coordinated leadership in making our Convention a good and meaningful experience in 2015.

2. Whereas Patrick Atkinson and Paul Maloney have brought important and essential information about Human Trafficking to the Diocese of North Dakota; and

Whereas, Canons John Floberg, Zanne Ness, the Rev. Michael Paul, the staff of ITEMP, the God's Child Project, Pat Fearing, Odella Henley and the United Thank Offering, working together, have sought to inspire members of this Diocesan Convention to share this important information with the wider community by means of age-appropriate brochures;

**Therefore, Be it Resolved** by this 45th Convention of the Episcopal Church of the Diocese of North Dakota that we express our profound gratitude and pledge our prayers for ITEMP as they continue their important work.

3. Whereas, churches and organizations of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota have been greatly strengthened in their efforts to live as faithful followers of Jesus Christ and to serve the people of our communities in Christ's name by grants from the United Thank Offering of the Episcopal Church Women totaling \$977,020.80 since 1928; and Whereas, the United Thank Offering program has provided the people of the Diocese of North Dakota with a gentle nudge to recognize and to give thanks to God for the many blessings in our lives; and

Whereas, The Rev. Heather Melton, Coordinator from the United Thank Offering at the offices of the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society, and Kayla Massey, Julia Chester Emery Young Adult Service Corps Volunteer have graciously agreed to be present with us at our Diocesan Convention this year;

**Therefore, Be it Resolved** by this 45th Convention of the Episcopal Church of the Diocese of North Dakota that we express our gratitude for the ongoing support through the years of the many ministries of our Diocese by the United Thank Offering and

**Be it further Resolved** that each of our congregations be encouraged to continue to recognize and express our thanksgiving to God for our many blessings through contributions via the United Thank Offering.

4. Whereas we members of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota believe in the Communion of the Saints; and Whereas some who have labored among us have been called by our Savior Jesus Christ to rest from their labors; and Whereas we love and miss these valiant laborers in Our Lord's Vineyard;

**Therefore,** Be it resolved by this 45th Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota that we are grateful to God for the lives and faithful witness of The Rev. Eustis Cowardin and the Rev. The Bishop announced that next year's convention will be held at the Radisson in Bismarck on October 14-15, 2016.

The Bishop asked for a motion to adjourn the convention. A motion was made, seconded and passed to adjourn the 2015 Annual Convention at 1:39 p.m. and the convention concluded with a prayer offered by the Bishop.

#### **NOTES & EXPLANATIONS FOR THE 2016 BUDGET**

Chairs of committees appointed by Bishop Michael at the last Diocesan Convention were asked to submit 2016 budget requests. Other budget figures are a result of Diocesan policy, input from Bishop Smith, 2014 actual and 2015 estimated expenditures, and projected cost figures gathered from other sources. The proposed budget represents recommendations by the Finance Committee and approved by Diocesan Council.

#### A few items to note:

NDCIM: The NDCIM budget (highlighted lines) is funded by the General Convention grant for Native American Ministry and a grant for a Tribal Campus Chaplain. The total of these grants for 2016 is \$192,933. In order to continue receiving these grants, the Diocese must ensure the grant funds are spent on Native American Ministry. These expenses must be equal to or greater than the funds received.

Investment Fund Transfers (Line 3): We have drawn only \$50,000 of the budgeted amount from our investments so far this year. This is because our cash flow has remained steady due to the Royalty Income, the General Convention Grant, and Our Fair Share payments. We do expect to draw at least another \$50,000 by the end of the year.

Royalty Income (Line 13): The Diocese owns several mineral rights in the Bakken. At the beginning of 2014, the Diocesan Council created the Bakken Ministry reserve fund. Monies in this fund are a result of bonus payments from mineral leases and royalty income received above the budgeted amount. The Diocesan Council has ear-marked this money to be used for ministry in the oil fields. Specifically, to assist St. John's, Dickinson, in their partnership with a Lutheran pastor (\$10,000 annually for three years beginning August 15,2014, and ending August 15, 2017) and to pay utilities and mortgage interest related to the rectory purchased by the Diocese for St. Peter's, Williston.

Following are notes/comments to provide additional information about some of the proposed budget items:

# **INCOME**

<u>Line 2 - Our Fair Share</u>: It is recommended that OFS percent remain the same in 2016 as in previous years at 20%. Calculation for OFS is as follows:

Actual Prior Year End (2014) / Prior Year Percent (2014 was 20%) X Budget Percent (20%). \$234,930 / 20% = \$1,174,650 X 20% = \$234,930

<u>Line 3 - Investment Fund Transfers</u>: The year-end balances are \$2,558,987.98, \$2,788,590.75 and \$2,759,031.00 respectively for an average of \$2,702,203.24. For 2015, we have been budgeted to draw 6.75%. The proposed budget shows remaining at the same percentage as 2015. Below are income figures per percentage of draw:

<u>Line 5 - General Convention Grant:</u> The Diocese will receive \$181,333 per year for the triennium (2016-2018) for Native American Ministry. This was passed at General Convention in 2015.

Line 7 - Bishop's Additional Employment: None expected.

<u>Line 8 - From Designated Funds:</u> The proposed budget shows \$14,071 of which \$11,571 is to come from Bakken Ministry Reserve fund to offset utilities and mortgage interest related to the Williston Rectory (Line 161) and \$2,500 is to come from Sudanese Ministry reserve fund to offset Line 40 (Sudanese Ministry).

<u>Line 10 - Sheaf Donations:</u> Based on prior years actual donations.

Line 11 - Youth Program Income: None expected.

<u>Line 12 - Convention Income:</u> Diocesan Convention registrations and Clergy/Ministers Conferences.

<u>Line 13 - Royalty Income:</u> Income from our producing wells in the Bakken. With input from Bart Davis, proposed budget shows \$15,000.

<u>Line 14 – Tribal Campus Ministry Grant:</u> The Diocese will receive a grant for \$11,600 for 2 years (2015-2016) for Native American Campus Ministry.

#### **EXPENDITURES**

<u>Line 20 - National Church Program:</u> At General Convention, the Episcopal Church funding formula changed. This year, dioceses are asked to pay 18% of net operating income earned two years prior to the budget year with the first \$150,000 exempt (previously was 19%, with the first \$120,000 exempt). The \$181,000 General Convention grant and the \$11,600 Tribal Campus Ministry grant are also exempt. The Episcopal Church will be reducing the amount asked of dioceses over the triennium to 16.5% in 2017 and 15% in 2018. To fulfill the 18% asked, the budget figure will be \$42,642, which is less than the current year.

<u>Line 21 - General Convention Deputies:</u> The next General Convention will be held in 2018 in Austin, Texas. Cost of the 2015 General Convention was approximately \$20,000 to send 3 clergy delegates and 3 lay delegates. To ensure there is enough in the reserve to send 4 and 4 we need to budget \$8,000 each year for 3 years (2016-2018). (The bishop's GC expenses will come out of his travel expense.)

Line 22 - Province VI Assessment: An assessment that is paid to Province VI quarterly.

<u>Line 23 - Province VI Synod Delegates:</u> Provincial Synod will now take place every 3 years, the same as General Convention. To make sure there is enough to send 4 delegates every 3 years, there should be \$4,000 in the reserve fund by 2018. By the end of 2015, there will be just over \$4,000. The proposed budget shows \$0 for 2016; however the line item will be kept for future budget use.

<u>Line 24 - Lambeth Conference:</u> Budgeted amount goes into a reserve fund to pay the expenses of the bishop's and spouse's attendance at Lambeth Conference, which meets every ten years.

Line 25 - ND Conference of Churches: Nothing budgeted. The ND Conference of Churches has disbanded.

<u>Lines 28-46 - Programs & Outreach:</u> The program and outreach line items reflect mostly what was requested by the committees with a few adjustments made.

- Decreased Youth Program (Line 33) from \$3,000 to \$2,000 (same as 2015).
- Decreased East African Mission (Line 41) from \$5,000 to \$2,500 (same as 2015).
- Decreased Refugee Resettlement (Line 45) from \$3,000 to \$2,000.

<u>Lines 48-155 - Salary & Benefits:</u> Salaries and stipends are based on step (.25%) increase. As of May 2015, the Consumer Price Index shows COLA at 0%.

Family medical/dental/vision insurance and a \$25,000 term life insurance policy are provided for the bishop, clergy employed by the diocese, and diocesan office staff. The premiums in the 2016 proposed budget reflects a 6% increase over 2015. Life insurance premiums remain the same. The Employee Assistance Program (EAP) is a confidential counseling service offered to employees and non-stipendiary clergy.

<u>Lines 57-62 - Episcopate Program Expenses:</u> Any remainder from Travel Expense (Line 60) will be transferred to Diocesan Car Reserve at end of year.

<u>Lines 74, 84, 94, and 102 – Canon Missioner Continuing Ed:</u> Diocesan Council voted that any annual unused portion of continuing education money for diocesan- employed clergy can be put into the Masuda Fund (designated for the individual clergy's use).

The proposed budget shows following changes to the Salary & Benefit section:

- Decreased Episcopate Automobile Purchase (Line 59) from \$4,000 to \$2,000.
- Decreased Canon Missioner East Travel (Line 93) from \$7,860 to \$2,800.

#### Lines 157-169 - Other Congregational Support

<u>Line 158 - Move/Interview Mission Clergy:</u> The proposed budgeted amount goes into a reserve fund to be used to help newly-hired clergy move into the diocese. In 2015, the diocese used approximately \$4,500 to move Fr. Michael Paul from Fargo to Williston. The current balance of the fund is \$2,500.

Line 159 - Indian Property Repairs: Part of the NDCIM budget.

<u>Line 160 - CM House Insurance/Repairs:</u> Annual insurance premium of \$2414 and \$700 for repairs to the rectory in Bismarck. 75% to come from NDCIM budget.

Line 161 – Williston (St. Peter's Rectory): \$2671 annual insurance premium, \$1400 utilities, \$7500 mortgage interest.

<u>Lines 162-168 - Indian Property Insurance:</u> Figures in the 2016 proposed budget are actual premiums provided by Church Insurance. The premiums represent approximately a 7% increase over 2015. Part of the NDCIM budget.

#### Lines 171-204 - Administrative Expenses

<u>Lines 172-178 - NDCIM General Expenses:</u> Part of the NDCIM budget.

Lines 180-184 - Administrative Meetings:

<u>Line 181 - Convention:</u> The proposed budget amount is the actual cost of last year's convention.

<u>Line 182 - Diocesan Council/Standing Committee:</u> The proposed budget amount is based on the cost of Diocesan Council/Standing Committee meetings in 2014 and so far in 2015. Costs include hotel, mileage and meals for three meetings per year plus council members' rooms at Diocesan Convention. The proposed budget shows \$12,000. The Finance Committee has encouraged the Diocesan Council/Standing Committee to find cost saving measures for meeting expenses (such as carpooling).

Line 183 - Other Administrative Meetings: Budget for finance and other committee meetings.

<u>Lines 186-203 - Office Expenses, Insurance and Misc:</u> Includes office supplies, postage, internet, copy machine, etc. Proposed budget amounts are based on actual 2014 and so far in 2015.

<u>Line 189 – Equipment/Maintenance</u>: Budgeted amount goes into a reserve fund for office equipment and software. The accounting software used has a yearly maintenance/update/ security subscription of \$1,200. Additionally, it is likely that Bishop Michael will need a new laptop in the next year.

<u>Lines 196-198 – Insurance</u>: Figures in the 2016 proposed budget are actual amounts of premiums provided by Church Insurance which represent approximately a 7% increase over 2015.

<u>Line 203 – Interest Expense:</u> This figure represents the mortgage interest for the Canon Missioner Residence in Bismarck.

#### **2014 FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS**

**2014 Income & Expense vs. Budget:** We ended the year with a net loss of \$5,633.

- Income: Overall income was \$18,285 under budget.
  - Our Fair Share: The Diocese received \$234,930 in Our Fair Share payments, which was \$12,770 over the budgeted amount.
  - Investment Fund Transfers: The budgeted amount of Investment Fund Transfers for 2014 was \$181,523 (7%). The actual amount taken was \$150,000 (5.80%). Cash flow remained steady through-out the year, so it was not necessary to take the cash from investments.
  - o **General Convention Grant and Other Income items**: General convention grant and other miscellaneous income items came in at or around the budgeted figures.
- Expenses: Overall expenses were \$12,649 under budget.
  - Extra-Diocesan: Amounts were as budgeted. These were either set amounts or went into reserve funds, where they are expended.
  - **Program:** This section was under budget by \$596. A few committees and/or programs did not spend the full amount budgeted.
  - Salary & Benefits: This section was \$13,021 under budget mainly due to the staff change from Kevin Goodrich to Christian Senyoni, several travel expenses not fully utilized, and Diocesan Office Staff continuing education not being used.
  - **Congregational support:** This section was over budget by \$2,798 due to insurance premiums being higher than budgeted.
  - Administrative Expenses: This section was under budget by \$1,829.

**Investments:** The market value of our investment account as of December 31, 2014 was \$2,759,031. As a comparison, the market value at year end over the past ten years has been:

#### **2015 FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS TO DATE**

#### 2015 Income & Expense vs. Budget

- *Income:* As of August 31, the Diocese has received \$115,279 in Our Fair Share (OFS), which is 49% of budget. This amount is down 1% from last year at this time. In addition, we received \$7,956 which was OFS due from 2014. Our cash flow has remained steady due to the Royalty Income, the General Convention Grant, and OFS payments. Due to these reasons, we have transferred only 28% (\$50,000) of our 2015 budgeted amount from investments. A few items to note:
  - From Designated Funds (Line 8) includes offset from Bakken Ministry Fund for Williston rectory utilities and mortgage interest (Line 167) as well as for Automobile Purchase (line 59).
  - o Royalty Income (line 13). We are under the amount budgeted for Royalty Income. Per Bart Davis it is unlikely that we will reach the 2015 budget amount of \$22,000. Currently we are pursuing, with three other beneficiaries, title to three producing wells. There was a break in the chain of title resulting in royalties being held in escrow.

- **Expenses:** Most expenses are moving right on track as budgeted (at or around 66.67% of budget). A few items to note:
  - Stewardship (line 32) is slightly over budget. We sent two attendees to the stewardship conference at Camp Allen in May. Airfare from Williston to Houston was quite expensive.
  - o Bishop Michael has used his continuing education budget for his sabbatical (Line 54).
  - Williston (St. Peter's Rectory) (Line 167) is for utilities and mortgage interest. The offset account for this
    expense is From Designated Funds (Line 8, specifically from Bakken Ministry).
  - o Audit (line 201) came in slightly higher than budgeted.
  - Interest Expense (Line 209) represents Bismarck rectory mortgage interest. This line was added following discussion at last August's Council meeting at the suggestion of the auditors to increase the transparency of our reporting.
- Bottom Line: The bottom line of -\$79,661 is significantly lower than last year at this time (-\$140,420).

#### **Liabilities & Net Assets (Balance Sheet)**

- **Operating Fund:** The operating fund shows the various unrestricted designated and temporarily restricted fund balances (see pages 15-18 for specific fund descriptions). Some of these have no activity through the year and others have a number of transactions.
  - o **Grants Received:** Canon John Floberg submitted two grant proposals to the United Thank Offering of which both were awarded. The first grant in the amount of \$43,500 is for building tiny houses on the property at St. James', Cannon Ball. The homes will form the nucleus of a program that gathers half a dozen young adult men (18 30) as a means to restoring the promise of their lives. The second grant, in the amount of \$50,000, is for a Human Trafficking awareness campaign. With the Diocese of South Dakota as a partner, brochures, flyers and posters will be distributed throughout both states.

#### • Trust & Endowment Fund:

- Pooled Investment Fund: The Pooled Investment Fund (PIF), consisting of investments from the Diocese, the North Dakota Episcopal Foundation and Gethsemane Cathedral Foundation, became a reality effective June 1, 2015. St. Stephen's joined the PIF in July.
  - The PIF Investment Committee members are Leo Wilking (Acting Chair), Bart Davis, John Floberg, Dick Anderson and John Baird. - The Diocesan investment portion of the PIF as of August 31, 2015, is \$2,648,016.
- We owe \$85,932 on the Canon Missioner's house in Bismarck. In January 2015, the Diocese, at the direction of Diocesan Council, purchased a house in Williston for a Bakken Missioner/Rector of St. Peter's. We owe \$241,465 on the Williston Rectory. There are two congregations who have outstanding loans from the diocese: (1) St. Peter's, Walhalla, with a balance of \$2,853, and (2) Advent, Devils Lake, with a balance of \$25,699. Advent makes monthly payments. St. Peter's has not made a payment since 2012.
- The building and property of the Church of the Good Shepherd in Lakota was sold in September. Proceeds from the sale will be deposited into the Real Estate fund.

# Bishop's Sermon To the Forty-fifth Annual Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota October 17, 2015

"Just as you did it to one of the least of my brothers and sisters, you did it to me" (Matthew 25:40).

One of the issues argued about during the Reformation was the issue of salvation. Was a person "justified" or made right before God through faith or by good works? In other words, do I earn my salvation by being good or by trusting and believing in Christ? Protestants fought for "faith"; Roman Catholics for "works."

Turns out, like so many other religious controversies, both needed the other's perspectives to understand the whole truth. It took about five hundred years before Pope John Paul II and the Lutheran World Federation signed an agreement that stated: "Together we confess: By grace alone, in faith in Christ's saving work and not because of any merit on our part, we are accepted by God and receive the Holy Spirit, who renews our hearts while equipping and calling us to good works."

You see it is not a question of faith or works. It is the evidence of a faith that works. In my opinion, they could have found the answer much sooner had they simply read the Letter of James where we heard today: "Faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead" (James 2:17).

The workshops many of us experienced yesterday on Human Trafficking were eye opening to me on a visceral level. I attended those held on Thursday. I felt sick to my stomach during the presentations and had a difficult time sleeping that night. The fact that such evil exists in this world and so close to home is something I have a difficult time getting my head around. And these words of Jesus also reverberate in my mind: "Just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me" (Matthew 25:45).

Do what? Feed the hungry; provide drink to the thirsty; welcome the stranger; clothe the naked; visit the sick and those in prison. These works of mercy call us to care for those most vulnerable and in need, and they are an indispensable part of what we are called to do as followers of Christ. We are doing some of that in this Diocese. In the words of Patrick Atkinson: "We do the best we can."

A review of the issues of our diocesan newsletter, The Sheaf, since our last Convention provides evidence of such activity:

- •We have supported healing in South Sudan through Episcopal Relief & Development.
- •We provided assistance to those affected by the Devils Lake flooding on the Spirit Lake Nation through Episcopal Relief & Development.
- •We contributed to projects around the world through United Thank Offering.
- •We ordained Paul Zaharia and Erin Richards to the priesthood, and almost immediately they reached beyond Minot to Dunseith and Williston.
- •St. Peter's in Williston started a monthly community dinner for the homeless and raised money to support a clinic in Liberia and our annual Guatemala medical mission.
- •St. John's in Dickinson has been involved in collecting warm clothes for those discharged from the emergency room of the local hospital.
- •St. Paul's in Grand Forks has been feeding hungry children and supporting their neighbor, the Northland Rescue Mission
- •St. Thomas in Fort Totten and Gethsemane Cathedral in Fargo have started community gardens to feed hungry people and encourage healthy eating.

- •Volunteers joined John Baird of St. Stephen's in Fargo on their annual medical mission to Guatemala. (The bishop of Guatemala told me this past summer that he is very grateful for this ministry.)
- •The East Africa Scholarship Committee led by Thom Marubbio of St. Stephen's in Fargo working with people from St. John's in Moorhead is providing educations for young people in developing countries, a gift that will keep on giving.
- •Grace Church in Jamestown continues to reach out to people on the margins through their Sunday evening worship service and meal.
- •The Standing Rock communities are making strides to begin campus ministry at tribal colleges, building upon their successful youth programs through Young Life and Camp Gabriel.
- •You loaned me out to facilitate a preaching course and worship leader training in Navajoland and Alaska.

People are identifying needs and finding ways to make a difference. I hope, as a result of our focus on "Human Trafficking" at this Convention, that we are able to make a difference, especially in the area of prevention. We will do the best we can.

We are in a period of transition in this Diocese. New and capable leaders have arrived to lead several of our congregations: Jim Zotalis here at St. George's in Bismarck; Larry Thiele at St. Thomas in Fort Totten; Alex Waters at St. John's in Moorhead; Michael Paul as the Bakken Missioner in Williston; and Mark Strobel as the new dean of Gethsemane Cathedral. I expect good things from these fresh leaders and the congregations they serve.

We also said goodbye to two of our beloved clerics: Mother Eusty Cowardin of Jamestown and Deacon Dolores Walters of Fort Yates. May they rest in peace and rise in glory!

Financially, we have been able to reach a goal we had set for ourselves long ago. For the first time anyone can remember we are able to pay our full asking to the national church! This is remarkable. Job well done.

On the other hand, we were not able to continue the slow decrease on the draw from our endowments. There is a growing consensus, at least among the Finance Committee, that our future sustainability will require either a part-time bishop with canon missioners, or a full-time bishop with no canon missioners, or merging with another diocese, or sharing a bishop with another diocese. There are probably other options about which we have not yet thought, but it is time to begin serious discernment about the future.

Sisters and brothers, we live in an uncertain time concerning the future of institutional churches. No one can predict the future, but things are slowly but surely changing. Of one thing I am certain. We serve a living God who has sent his Son, Jesus, to be "a light to the nations, to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness" (Isaiah 42:6-7). May we who claim to be his followers possess the will to be empowered by the Spirit for service in this same mission.
