The Forty-Seventh Annual Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota October 21, 2017 Bismarck, North Dakota

The Forty-Seventh Annual Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota was called to order with opening prayers led by the Rt. Rev. Michael Smith, Bishop of North Dakota, at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, October 21, 2017, at the Radisson Hotel in Bismarck.

The Bishop announced the following appointments for convention:

The Bishop welcomed visitors: Bishop Carol Gallagher (Montana), Pat Eustis, Interim Rector of St. Georges Bismarck, and Ryan Fischer, Interim Rector of St. Paul's Grand Forks. All have seat and voice; Eustis has vote.

The Bishop called on Deacon Beth Lipp (St. George's, Bismarck), chair of credentials committee, for a report. Lipp announced that 27/36 clergy and 69/100 of lay delegates have registered making a quorum. Three guests were also in attendance.

2016 Convention Minutes approved as submitted.

The Bishop announced the nomination and election of:

- Julie Helgaas (Gethsemane, Fargo) for Secretary of Convention
- o Robert Fox (St. Paul's, White Shield) for Treasurer of the Diocese
- Don Henderson (St. Paul's, Grand Forks) for Standing Committee Lay (3-year term)
- Terry Overbo (Gethsemane, Fargo) for Standing Committee Clergy (3-year term)
- Virginia Luger (Standing Rock), Christian Senyoni (Grace, Jamestown), Eroll Holness (St. Peter's, Williston) for Episcopal Foundation for Ministry in Higher Education. EFMHE will decide terms.

2017 Diocesan Convention Resolution #1: Resolution for Reconciliation – Carmine Goodhouse (St. Luke's, Ft. Yates), Brandon Mauai (St. Luke's, Ft. Yates), Tom Tudor (St. George's Bismarck).

Discussion of Resolution. Mauai proposed the following amendment. Paragraph 2 insert *former* before Tribal Chairman, paragraph 5 <u>strike</u> *commend Dave Archambault* and replace with *encourage Chairman Mike Faith*. Second, approved.

Leslie Ross (St. John's, Dickinson), proposed amendment to paragraph 5 <u>strike</u> *who are on the path*, replace with *towards*. Seconded, approved.

Mauai motion to postpone discussion until after Regional Meetings. Approved.

2017 Diocesan Convention #2 Resolution: Proposed Policy for the Use of Alcohol at Diocesan or Congregation sponsored Activities or Functions – Proposed by Diocesan Council.

Tudor amendment delete *or may choose to take no action*. Amendment passes. Discussion of Resolution. Passed.

Bishop called on the Rev. Mark Strobel (Gethsemane, Fargo ND), for Dispatch of Business.

- Convention evaluation will be by email via survey or a paper copy is available.
- Rooms were announced for East and West regional meetings to be held at 1 o'clock, following lunch.

Convention business adjourned temporarily in order to travel to St. George's for the convention Eucharist.

Following the convention Eucharist, lunch, and the regional meetings, the convention reconvened for the afternoon's business.

Josh Floberg (St. James, Cannon Ball) reported on his experiences with the Episcopal Youth Event beginning in 2016.

Consideration #1 Resolution for Reconciliation - Brandon Mauai

Amendment: 2nd paragraph <u>strike</u> *are modeling* and <u>insert</u> *have started on-* passed. The resolution as amended, passed.

Carmine Goodhouse proposed changing the name of the Diocesan Anti-Racial Committee to Racial Reconciliation Committee. Approved.

Report of Credentials, Beth Lipp: Clergy 27/30, Lay 70/100

The Bishop called on Robert Fox (St. Paul's, White Shield), treasurer for the diocese, to present the 2018 budget and recommend approval. The 2018 Budget passed.

Leo Wilking (St. Stephens, Fargo) reported on the ND Episcopal Foundation. He noted the gift from the Carol Stoudt estate.

The Bishop referred to the sheet in packets appointing various Committees of the Diocese. The Diocese ratified the Disciplinary Board.

Addendum

2017 Diocesan Convention Resolutions (Final)

#1. Resolution for Reconciliation

Whereas, This 47th Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota acknowledges the strained relationship between Tribal Nations and their citizens and Governments and citizens that have existed for hundreds of years. The dispute over the Dakota Access Pipeline serves as a reminder of our fragile relationships. As a church, we are called to recognize the brokenness of human relationships, strive for justice, and work diligently for reconciliation; and

Whereas, The former Tribal Chairman Dave Archambault and Governor Doug Burgum along with many others have started on the pathway necessary to restore and further heal the people and bring about justice in our systems of interaction through honest dialogue, greater collaboration, and applying the power of forgiveness; and

Whereas, The Presiding Bishop, his staff and the resolutions of the General Convention encouraged our Church in North Dakota to stand for a peaceful and prayerful resolution to our present and past conflicts as is our commitment in the Church's repudiation of the Doctrine of Discovery; so therefore be it

Resolved, That the 47th Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota give thanks to God for the bond of love and the reconciling work of Christ which hold us together in times of disagreement while remaining in the hard place of seeking justice and reconciliation; and be it further

Resolved, That this Convention encourage Mike Faith, Doug Burgum, and people of good will towards the path of reconciliation in the State of North Dakota. We express our commitment to working with the people in various forms of Tribal and State leadership to see a new day (*Anpao*) of restoration and healing rise at Standing Rock, Ft. Berthold, Turtle Mountain, Spirit Lake, and throughout the Church and the people of North Dakota.

#2. Policy for the Use of Alcohol at Diocesan or Congregation-Sponsored Activities or Functions

Resolved, that the Diocese of North Dakota adopt the following Policy for the Use of Alcohol at Diocesan-sponsored Activities or Functions:

The purpose of this policy is to provide a structure for the reasonable and responsible use of alcohol at events of the Diocese of North Dakota. This policy is not intended to limit the authority of an individual congregation from adopting additional requirements; a congregation may adopt this policy and may add requirements or guidelines specific to its needs, or may adopt different requirements appropriate for its needs. This policy applies to events on and off Church premises, wherever Diocesan activities and functions are taking place.

I. Legal Requirements.

- 1. All applicable federal, state and local laws must be obeyed.
- 2. Under no circumstances may minors consume, sell, or distribute alcoholic beverages. The ONLY exception to serving alcohol to minors is during the administration of the sacrament of the Eucharist.

II. Diocesan Requirements.

- 1. If alcoholic beverages are served, a non-alcoholic alternative must be provided, with equal attractiveness, accessibility, and quantity.
- 2. The serving of alcoholic beverages may not be publicized as an attraction of the event.
- 3. The serving of alcoholic beverages is limited to beer and wine.
- 4. Alcoholic beverages may not be served when Diocesan business is being conducted.
- 5. Adults are prohibited from the use, possession, distribution, or being under the influence of alcohol, illegal drugs, or the misuse of legal drugs while participating in or assisting with programs or activities for children or youth.
- 6. Responsible adults are to be in control of the serving of alcoholic beverages; the serving of alcoholic beverages is to be monitored and controlled. Distributing alcoholic beverages to those who are intoxicated is prohibited.
- 7. Approval must be granted by either the Bishop or the Diocesan Council before alcohol may be served at a Diocesan-sponsored activity or function, and this policy applies to any activity or function at which the use of alcohol has been authorized.

And be it further **Resolved**, that by Diocesan Convention 2018, each congregation will adopt a written policy for the use of alcohol at its own functions and on its own premises and submit a copy to the diocesan office, which shall keep such policies on file. In making these policies, the congregation should consult the resolution from the 78th General Convention pertaining to alcohol use (<u>https://www.episcopalarchives.org/cgibin/acts/acts_resolution-complete.pl?resolution=2015-A158</u>).

2018 Budget Proposal and 2017 Treasurer's Report Presented to Diocesan Convention Bismarck, October 20-21, 2017

NOTES & EXPLANATIONS FOR THE 2018 BUDGET

Chairs of committees appointed by Bishop Michael at the last Diocesan Convention were asked to submit 2018 budget requests. Amounts as requested were inserted into the 2018 proposed budget. Other budget figures are a result of Diocesan policy, input from Bishop Michael, 2016 actual and 2017 estimated expenditures, and projected cost figures gathered from other sources. The proposed budget represents recommendations made by the Finance Committee and approved by Diocesan Council.

The NDCIM budget (highlighted in grey) is funded by the General Convention grant for Native American Ministry. The total of this grant for 2018 is \$181,333. In order to continue receiving these grants, the Diocese must ensure the grant funds are spent on Native American Ministry. These expenses must be equal to or greater than the funds received.

The Diocese owns several mineral rights in the Bakken. Monies in this fund are a result of bonus payments from mineral leases and royalty income received above the budgeted amount. The Diocesan Council has ear-marked this money to be used for ministry in the oil fields, specifically, to assist St. John's, Dickinson, in their partnership with a Lutheran pastor (\$13,000 annually through 2019) and to pay utilities, insurance and mortgage interest related to the rectory purchased by the Diocese for St. Peter's, Williston.

Following are notes/comments to provide additional information about some of the proposed budget items:

INCOME

<u>Line 2 - Our Fair Share</u>: It is recommended that OFS percent remain the same in 2018 as in previous years at 20%. Calculation for OFS is as follows:

Actual Prior Year End (2016) / Prior Year Percent (2016 was 20%) X Budget Percent (20%). \$218,418 / 20% = \$1,092,090 X 20% = \$218,418

Line 3 – Trust & Endowment Fund Transfers: In 2016 we began showing the Designated/Restricted Funds held in the Operating Fund as a committed portion of the Trust & Endowment (T & E) Fund. We use a three-year moving average method based on the year-end T & E Fund balance minus designated/restricted funds. Based on this, the year-end balances for 2014, 2015 and 2016 are \$2,345,068.82, \$2,007,835.31 and \$2,309,401.67, respectively, for a three-year moving average of \$2,220,768.60. The finance committee recommends a 6% draw. Below are income figures per percentage:

Line 5 - General Convention Grant: The Diocese will receive \$181,333 per year for the triennium (2016-2018) for Native American Ministry.

<u>Line 7 - Bishop's Additional Employment:</u> Bishop Michael will be working quarter-time with the Diocese of Dallas in 2018. These funds are excluded from the Episcopal Church Program asking formula.

<u>Line 8 - From Designated Funds</u>: Includes \$16,700 from Bakken Ministry reserve to offset utilities, insurance and mortgage interest related to the Williston Rectory (Line 152); \$13,000 from Bakken Ministry reserve to offset Dickinson partnership (Line 151) and \$7,000 from Sudanese Ministry reserve fund to offset Line 38 (Sudanese Ministry).

Line 10 - Sheaf Donations: Based on prior years' actual donations.

Line 11 - Youth Program Income: None expected.

Line 12 – Convention/Event Income: Registrations for Diocesan Convention and Clergy/Ministers Conferences.

<u>Line 13 - Royalty Income</u>: Income from our producing wells in the Bakken. \$29,000, albeit high, is based on actual royalty payments received from May 2016-May 2017.

Line 14 – Tribal Campus Ministry Grant: None expected. The grant was for 2015-2016.

EXPENDITURES

<u>Line 20 - Episcopal Church Program</u>: In 2018, dioceses are asked to pay 15% (down from 18% and 16.5% in 2016 and 2017, respectively) of net operating income earned two years prior to the budget year with the first \$150,000. The \$181,000 General Convention grant is also exempt. To fulfill the 15% asked, the budget figure will be \$33,809, which is less than the current year.

<u>Line 21 - General Convention Deputies</u>: The next General Convention will be held in 2018 in Austin, Texas. Cost of the 2015 General Convention was approximately \$20,000 to send 3 clergy delegates and 3 lay delegates. To ensure there is enough in the reserve to send 4 and 4, we need to budget \$8,000 each year for 3 years (2016-2018). (The bishop's GC expenses will come out of his travel expense.)

Line 22 - Province VI Assessment: An assessment that is paid to Province VI quarterly.

<u>Line 23 - Province VI Synod Delegates:</u> Provincial Synod will now take place every 3 years, the same as General Convention. To make sure there is enough to send 4 delegates every 3 years, there should be \$4,000 in the reserve fund by 2018. As of May 2017, there is just under \$4,000.

<u>Line 24 - Lambeth Conference</u>: Budgeted amount goes into a reserve fund to pay the expenses of the bishop's and spouse's attendance at Lambeth Conference, which meets every ten years.

<u>Line 25 – EDEIO</u>: The Diocese is now part of EDEIO (Episcopal Diocesan Ecumenical and Interreligious Officers). The annual dues are \$250 and \$750 is for a Diocesan representative to attend a conference. Mary Johnson is the appointed Diocesan representative.

<u>Lines 28-44 - Programs & Outreach</u>: The program and outreach line items reflect mostly what was requested by the committees with a few adjustments made the Finance Committee.

Line 30 – Commission on Ministry: Decreased from \$1,650 to \$1,100.

Line 32– Youth Program: Decreased from \$2,000 to \$1,400.

Line 42 – Haiti Mission: Decreased from \$5,000 to \$4,500.

Lines 46-145 - Salary & Benefits: Salaries and stipends are based on step (.25%) plus 1.5% increase. As of June 2017, the Consumer Price Index shows COLA at 1.7%.

Family medical/dental/vision insurance and a \$25,000 term life insurance policy are provided for the bishop, clergy employed by the diocese, and diocesan office staff. The Episcopal Church Medical Trust will not have 2018 premiums available until September. For budgetary purposes, the premiums in the 2018 proposed budget represent a 5% increase from 2017 (an average of the increases over the last 5 years). Life insurance premiums remain the same.

<u>Lines 55-60 - Episcopate Program Expenses</u>: Note: Any remainder from Line 58 (Travel Expense) will be transferred to Diocesan Car Reserve at end of year.

Lines 147-160 - Other Congregational Support

Line 148 - Move/Interview Mission Clergy: Nothing budgeted.

Line 149 - Indian Property Repairs: Same amount as 2017. Part of NDCIM.

<u>Line 150 – Bismarck Rectory House Insurance/Repairs:</u> Annual insurance premium of \$2837and \$800 for repairs to the rectory in Bismarck. 75% to come from NDCIM budget.

<u>Line 151 – Dickinson</u>: Partnership to assist in the ministry of Ellery Dykeman, Lutheran pastor serving St. John's. (Offset is line 8, to come from Bakken Ministry Fund.)

<u>Line 152 – Williston (St. Peter's Rectory)</u>: \$3200 annual insurance premium, \$2500 utilities, \$500 repairs, and \$10,500 mortgage interest. (Offset is line 8, to come from Bakken Ministry Fund.)

<u>Lines 153-159 - Indian Property Insurance</u>: The figures represent a 2% increase over 2017 premiums. Part of the NDCIM budget.

Lines 162-193 - Administrative Expenses

Lines 163-169 - NDCIM General Expenses: Same amount as 2017. Part of NDCIM.

Lines 171-175 - Administrative Meetings:

Line 172 - Convention: The proposed budget amount is the actual cost of last year's convention.

<u>Line 173 - Diocesan Council/Standing Committee:</u> The proposed budget amount is based on the cost of Diocesan Council/Standing Committee meetings in 2016 and, to date, in 2017. Costs include hotel, mileage and meals for three meetings per year plus Council members' rooms at Diocesan Convention.

Line 174 - Other Administrative Meetings: Budget for finance and other committee meetings.

Lines 177-192 - Office Expenses, Insurance and Misc: Includes office supplies, postage, internet, copy machine, etc. Proposed budget amounts are based on actual 2016 and, to date, in 2017.

<u>Line 179 – Equipment/Maintenance</u>: Budgeted amount goes into a reserve fund for office equipment and software. The accounting software used has a yearly maintenance/update/security subscription of \$1,300.

<u>Line 185 – Audit:</u> At the direction of Finance Committee, bids from auditing firms were sought. Five firms were contacted with two bids being received from Fiebiger, Swanson & West and Widmer Roel. Finance Committee recommends and Diocesan Council approves to accept the Widmer Roel audit proposal.

Lines 186-187 – Insurance: The figures represent a 2% increase over 2017 premiums.

Line 192 – Interest Expense: This figure represents the mortgage interest for the Rectory in Bismarck.

2016 FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

2016 Income & Expense vs. Budget: We ended the year with a net loss of -\$81,116 (excluding designated/restricted funds).

- Our actual draw (factoring in the use of designated/restricted funds as cash flow) was 3.75% vs 6.75% budgeted. If we had taken an additional withdrawal from the Endowment to cover the shortfall of our draw would have been 6.75%, the budgeted draw. As we ended the year with a checking account balance of \$157,666, there was not a need to take an additional withdrawal.
- Expenses were under budget by \$12,000 due largely in part to a travel budgets not being utilized.

Trust & Endowment Fund: The Diocesan investment portion of the Pooled Investment Fund (PIF) as of December 31, 2016, was \$2,671,610. Of this dollar amount, \$362,208 (as of 12-31-16), was committed to operating fund (designated funds). As a comparison, the market value at year end over the past ten years has been:

207 FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS TO DATE

2017 Income & Expense vs. Budget

- **Income:** As of August 31, the Diocese has received \$118,224 in Our Fair Share (OFS), which is 50% of budget. This amount is up 2% from last year at this time. Our cash flow has remained steady due to the Royalty Income, the General Convention Grant, and OFS payments. Due to these reasons, we have not transferred any of our 2017 budgeted amount from investments. A few items to note:
 - From Designated Funds (Line 8) includes offset from Bakken Ministry Fund for Williston rectory utilities and mortgage interest (Line 167) as well as for Sudanese Ministry (Line 40).
- Expenses: Most expenses are moving right on track as budgeted (at or around 66.67% of budget).

Liabilities & Net Assets (Balance Sheet)

- **Operating Fund:** The operating fund shows the various unrestricted-designated and temporarily restricted fund balances (see pages 12-17 for specific fund descriptions). Some of these have no activity through the year and others have a number of transactions.
- Trust & Endowment Fund:
 - The Diocesan investment portion of the PIF as of August 31, 2017, is \$2,888,284. Of this dollar amount, \$476,322 is committed to the operating fund (designated funds).
 - We owe \$72,003 on the Rectory in Bismarck and \$216,705 on the Williston Rectory. The balance of the loan granted to Advent, Devils Lake is \$16,987 of which monthly payments of \$420 are received.
 - In August 2017, Diocesan Council voted (10-4) to remove the Diocesan funds from the North Dakota Pooled Investment Fund and invest with the Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society (The Episcopal Church).

Bishop's Sermon To the Forty-Seventh Annual Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of North Dakota October 21, 2017

Whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant (Mark 10:43-45).

As an aging baby boomer and hippy wannabe of yesteryear, I actually used to state as one of my life's goals "to be happy." (Wow, man, that's deep.) Life certainly looks and feels differently in my sixties than it did in my twenties. And one of the important lessons I have learned is that "happiness" is *not* an appropriate life goal, but rather happiness is a by-product of a well-lived life.

Ralph Waldo Emerson was not known for his Christian faith. (After all, even the Unitarians were too much for him.) But no one has said it better than he when he wrote in the nineteenth century: "The purpose of life is not to be happy. It is to be useful, to be honorable, to be compassionate, to have it make some difference that you have lived and lived well."

Jesus says: "Whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many" (Mark 10:43-45). Jesus, the servant, calls his people to follow in his footsteps as servants as well.

This downward mobility goes against the grain of our culture, but within it one finds a kernel of wisdom for life in the Kingdom of God, and dare I even suggest a well-lived life with accompanying happiness? In another place, Jesus says that, "Those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for [his] sake will find it" (Matt. 16:25). That oftentimes surprising paraphrase known as *The Message* says it another way:

Then Jesus went to work on his disciples. Anyone who intends to come with me has to let me lead. You're not in the driver's seat; I am. Don't run from suffering; embrace it. Follow me and I'll show you how. Self-help is no help at all. Self-sacrifice is the way, my way, to finding yourself, your true self. What kind of deal is it to get everything you want but lose yourself?

How have we as a local church, as the Diocese of North Dakota, been doing in our call to imitate Jesus, the servant, as we serve him by serving others? Reviewing issues of the past year from the diocesan newsletter, *The Sheaf*, gives us a glimpse:

- The Youth Group of Grace Church in Jamestown began last fall with a goal of reaching out to other youth in the area in working within the Five Marks of Mission. What are the Five Marks of Mission? 1. To proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom. 2. To teach, baptize and nurture new believers. 3. To respond to human need by loving service. 4. To seek to transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind and to pursue peace and reconciliation. 5. To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth. (Now, there's something there for everyone's passion.)
- St. Peter's in Williston continues to provide monthly community suppers for the elderly, homeless, and needy. They serve 50-80 people each month.
- The churches at Standing Rock provided a Christmas celebration for 400 people from the DAPL protest camps, as well as meals and shelter for those suffering from the winter cold at St. James' in Cannonball and St. Luke's in Fort Yates.
- The East Africa Scholarship Committee has been sponsoring students in Rwanda, Uganda, Kenya, and Sudan for almost 20 years.
- The "Piece-makers" at St. George's, Bismarck made 27 quilts and 43 pillow cases to give to the Charles Hall Youth program, the Burleigh County Child Protective Advocacy services, and as a fundraiser for scholar-ships for six students in South Sudan.

- A group of ten from the Diocese visited Haiti last summer and have been instrumental in building handwashing stations at a school without running water using resources from the North Dakota Episcopal Foundation, St. George's Church in Bismarck, and the Diocese of Dallas.
- Grace Church in Jamestown partnered with the University of Jamestown to sponsor Patrick Atkinson's presentation on human trafficking. And their youth partnered with Bread of Life Episcopal ministry to serve Ministry on the Margins in Bismarck by stocking their food pantry and serving breakfast to the hungry.

To what other forms of service is the Lord calling us in the year ahead? Small numbers and shrinking resources are no excuse.

Admittedly, the mainline churches such as ours live in a time of institutional decline. While there are places that are blessed to be able to be exceptions to the rule of decrease, most of our congregations, and not just in North Dakota but throughout the Episcopal Church, are unable to afford to support full-time clergy and live with the reality of aging members and dwindling numbers. (At a recent diocesan council meeting, someone remarked that we collectively seem to be moaning because of sore knees a lot more than we used to as we walk down the basement steps to the meeting.)

Before we become too depressed, however, perhaps it is time to remember what God is able to accomplish with small, committed groups of people. Remember, there were only twelve apostles, Jesus himself said he would be in the midst of two or three people gathered in his name, and stories of "the remnant," or those remaining faithful people are told time and again in the Old Testament. This morning we heard God speak of such a remnant through the prophet Zechariah:

Thus says the LORD of hosts: Even though it seems impossible to the remnant of this people in these days, should it also seem impossible to me? ... Here shall be a sowing of peace; the vine shall yield its fruit, the ground shall give its produce, and the skies shall give their dew; and I will cause the remnant of the people to possess all these things (Zech. 8:6,12).

God's future belongs to someone, my sisters and brothers. I believe it belongs to the remnant who follow Jesus, the servant, as servants to those in need. Who knows? Such service might even bring us a little happiness.
