Why do you wish to serve and what gifts would you bring? As a priest, part of my ordination vows was "to take [my] share in the councils of the Church." As a girl, I was not permitted to sere as an acolyte; it would, therefore, be a great honor to serve as deputy. I would commit to representing our diocese with integrity.
