Initial Responsibilities:

The Youth and Young Adults Ministry Developer is a member of the diocesan Ministry Support Team, a circle of leadership supporting the development of ministry throughout the diocese that also includes the part-time Bishop Provisional, full-time Diocesan Minister, full-time Diocesan Administrator, and full-time Regional Coordinator for Episcopal Ministry in Northwestern North Dakota. This position reports to the Diocesan Minister.

Ministry development & support:

- Support clergy and lay leaders in creating ministry that develops youth and young adult spirituality and community within congregations and in wider communities, including college campuses
- Develop a group of leaders to share this work and create ways of engaging middle-school youth, high-school youth, and young adults through events, social media, and innovative forms of connection

- Identify opportunities to collaborate with and participate in wider church structures for connecting youth and young adults with one another and the church
- Participate in hiring and provide mentoring, supervision, resourcing, and encouragement for local youth leaders, especially in Native American contexts

Community organizing & networking:

- Make connections with people passionate about youth & young adult spiritual development and identify and develop leadership
- Identify and develop opportunities for partnering with colleges, campus ministries, and other youth and young-adult focused organizations and activities throughout the diocese
- Develop and coordinate social media groups for leadership and youth and young adults

Leadership development/pipeline:

- Help congregation leaders identify and nurture youth and young adults for leadership roles in local congregations, diocesan ministries, and the wider church
- Identify existing and/or lead the planning and implementation of leadership training aimed at youth and young adults and those who work with them

Cultural connections (especially in Native American communities):

- Identify and offer resources to help youth and young adults make connections among Christian and traditional and other spiritualities
- Help develop opportunities to connect youth to elders
